Spanish Proficiency Test	Students interested in taking Spanish Courses for non-native speakers are required to take a Spanish Proficiency Test. During orientation week, before registering courses, each student will be interviewed by the Spanish Language Coordinator to confirm their level of Spanish proficiency and be enrolled in the adequate Spanish course. The Courses of Spanish as a Second Language are managed by the Language Department. For more information about the course offering, please contact the Spanish Language Coordinator.

Courses available to exchange students	Students with a fluent Spanish Proficiency are entitled to enroll in English, French, and/or German language courses. Please note there are a few courses taught in English available for exchange and visiting students. All undergraduate courses are available, as long as course pre-requisites are met (except Medicine and Culinary Arts). IMPORTANT: The Courses' availability is subject to demand. Therefore, the International Affairs Office cannot guarantee a spot in the student's selected courses.

Credit system	When studying at the UDLAP at the undergraduate level, students are expected to take between 4 and 5 courses per semester. At Graduate level (Master), students are expected to take 2 courses per trimester. Most courses have 6 Academic units, which include weekly guided instruction and independent study hours for the entire duration of the 16-week semester or 10-week trimester. The total duration of each course is 48 hours.
Grading system	The passing grade at the undergraduate (Bachelor) level at UDLAP is 7.5 on a 0.0-10 scale At the graduate (Master) level, a passing grade in 8.0 on a 0.0-10.0 scale. At the end of the student's stay, the International Affairs Office will send one official transcript to the student's home university.

VISAS

International students wishing to study in Mexico must take into account the following information according to their nationality and duration of their studies in Mexico.

FOR 1 SEMESTER OF STUDY ONLY "VISITORS WITHOUT PERMISSION TO PERFORM PAID ACTIVITIES"

To participate in an academic program at UDLAP with duration of up to 180 days, students can travel to our country as a Visitor (previously known as *Tourist)* if they are citizens of a country without visa restrictions in Mexico. This condition of stay authorizes students to remain in Mexican national territory uninterruptedly for no more than 180 days from the date of entry, without permission to engage in remunerated activities. Foreigners who come to Mexico as Visitors without permission to perform remunerated activities cannot change their migratory status and will have to leave the country by the end of the authorized period of stay.

EXCEPTION: If the student come from a country with viosa restrictions in Mexico, he/she will need to request a Temporary Resident Visa-Student at the nearest Embassy or Consulate of Mexico, as he/she will not be able to enter the country as a visitor.

FOR 2 OR MORE SEMESTERS OF STUDY "TEMPORARY RESIDENT VISA- STUDENT"

To participate in an academic program at UDLAP for longer than 180 days, it is necessary to have a Temporary Resident Visa-Student, and students will need to complete a 3-step process:

- 1. Request for a visa at the nearest Embassy or Consulate of Mexico. The visa is issued for 180 calendar days, valid for a single entry to Mexico during this
- 2. When students enter Mexico at the Airport, they will be given a "Forma Migratoria Múltiple (FMM)" which they will need to present to the "Instituto Nacional de Migración (INM)" once they are in Mexico to get the Temporary Residence Permit.
- 3. Once in Mexico, a Temporary Residence Permit must be requested from the INM within the first 30 calendar days from the date of entry into the national territory. This card will be valid for one year and allows multiple entries to Mexico. If this procedure is not completed within the 30 designated days, the student will be subject to pay a fine to the INM.

The International Office provides information to all students about this process, but it is the student's responsibility to fulfill the INM's requirements.

Students coming from countries that require a visa to travel to Mexico must request it before traveling to Mexico. The UDLAP International Office will send an Acceptance Letter in order for students to process a student visa, if necessary.

Once you're in Mexico, you must register yourself with the Migration Services office at the UDLAP International Office.

MEDICAL INSURANCE COVERAGE

Medical insurance is mandatory

Without exception, all International students at UDLAP, are required to have health insurance coverage at their own expense that meets all the international coverage requirements (must include repatriation and emergency evacuation) necessary to cover them during the entire duration of their stay in Mexico. The students must provide a copy of their medical insurance policy to the International Affairs Office at UDLAP as a requirement to complete their registration process. This policy has to contain the following information:

ESTIMATED EXPENSES

On-Campus Housing:	When housing is not included in the exchange agreement, the student must pay the full amount before their
	arrival at UDLAP.
Meals (per month)	Around \$6,000 pesos per month
Local Transportation (one way)	\$ 7 pesos public bus – UDLAP bus \$8 pesos
Academic	\$2,000 pesos per semester. Textbooks may cost around \$500 pesos each (depending on the discipline).
Visiting Students	Visiting students need to pay a 2-unit processing fee, and 18-unit tuition deposit before their arrival at UDLAP
Personal	Movies cost about \$75 pesos. A night at the club can cost up to \$350 pesos.
Bank Information	Students are advised to bring an international credit or debit card. There are various ATM's located on campus and in the cities.
Banks Accounts	We do not recommend students to open a bank account if you can handle your finances through your home bank.
Cell Phone	Students are required to get a Mexican phone number and provide it to the International Affairs Office in order to be easily contacted in case of any emergencies.
