Students' rights and duties



- Law on Higher Education and Science

 came into force on October 1st 2018
- Rules of Study at the University of Warsaw

 came into force on October 1st 2019
- Academic programme of student's studies and cycle





- Student is a person enrolled in a program of first-cycle studies (undergraduate), second-cycle studies (graduate) or long-cycle studies conducted by a university authorized to run them- the University of Warsaw.
- Student status is acquired when the oath is taken;
- The loss of the student status takes place on the day of graduation or discontinuation of the studies.



Student ID card is a document certifying the student's status. Students are obliged to return their student ID cards upon the end of their studies.

Furthermore, student ID card serves as a library card. It also entitles students to a 50% discount on public transportation. It can act as a carrier of long term tickets. A 30-day city travel card and a 90-day city travel card may be coded on it. This can be done at any ticket selling point.

A student shall conduct himself or herself in accordance with the academic oath and observe administrative regulations in force at the University of Warsaw.

In particular, a student shall:

- Participate fully in the university's educational program;
- Pursue his or her studies in accordance with the overall study schedule and curriculum;

Up to the age of 26 we (students) have the right to apply for insurance paid by the University.



There is a Centermed clinic at the University of Warsaw (Krakowskie Przedmieście 26/28), which deals with medical care of students.

You may apply on **zdrowystudent.pl** website by filling in the application.



Another important act is the syllabus (available in USOS).

It's a kind of a contract between student and lecturer, which regulates the way of passing the course (for example: attendance, essay, exam, etc.).

IT CANNOT BE CHANGED DURING THE COURSE WITHOUT THE PERMISSION OF THE STUDENTS!



Every academic year has it's calendar with the examination sessions, vacations, etc., which is set before the classes start.

- ECTS points are the credits student obtain by passing the classes.
- Every student is obligated to collect at least 60 ECTS points each year.
- Every course has assigned number of ECTS points.



If student fails the course (including elective modules, foreign language class and PE), he or she has to retake it next semester or year and pay for the retake according to the amount of credits assigned to the course.

Some types of courses provided by other units of the University, may be burdened with some additional fees (especially foreign language class!).



Student is required to pass every course he or she has registered to.

But <u>one time</u> during the study cycle (undergraduate/graduate studies) she or he can resign from taking elective course:

• for winter semester – deadline for resignation is 18.01.2021;

• for summer semester -01.06.2022



Every student has a right to have two terms of passing the exam. Absence during the first term does not mean that student will have a negative grade!

If student has an explanation (medical condition confirmed by doctor's certificate or another exam at the same time) for being absent on the exam he or she can ask the co-ordinator for another date.



Grading scale at University of Warsaw is from 2 (lowest) to 5! (highest, counts as 5).

Grade 2 (insufficient) equals NOT PASSING THE CLASS!

NK means unclassified – the student hasn't fulfilled the requirements of passing the class – for ex. too many absences. If he or she doesn't talk with professor and explain the situation, which caused NK "grade", NK means in the end not passing the class and counts as grade 2.



Language Course Foreign language class and certificate

- Foreign language classes obligatory module for undergraduate students.
- Foreign language certificate every student is obligated to pass foreign language exam to get a certificate on B1 level until the end of second year.

Elective modules and PE Class

SU

- Elective modules (also called OGUN) elective courses provided by other units of University than the one student is studying at. Each programme has a specific number of ECTS credits student is supposed to obtain each year.
- PE Class PE classes are obligatory for undergraduate students.



Examination session

Students pass exams during the examination session. For the courses that "end with the final grade" the final test has to be carried out before the examination session will start.

In the case when student fails final test two times, he or she has the right to apply for a course retake (conditional clearing/promotion).

After getting a permission, student has to pay for a retake course depending on a number of credits (ECTS points).

The student has to get credit for this course next year.

Anti-Plagiarism Rules and Requirements

: to steal and pass off (the ideas or words of another) as one's own : use (another's production) without crediting the source

: to commit literary theft : present as new and original an idea or product derived from an existing source

Examples of Plagiarism

- Turning in someone else's work as your own,
- Changing words, but copying the sentence structure without giving credit,
- Buying someone's work/content,
- Copying words or ideas from someone without giving credit,
- Building on someone's ideas,
- Copying ideas and work that make up majority of your work, whether credited or not.



: to speak or write (a passage) from another usually with credit acknowledgment

If you use a direct quote, you must indicate the quote by placing "quotation marks" around the statement. Following the quotation marks, it is proper to either use an in-text citation or denote a footnote.

Source: "Quote." *Merriam-Webster.com Dictionary*, Merriam-Webster, https://www.merriam-webster.com/dictionary/quote.

Examples of Incorrect Quotation

- Giving incorrect information about the source of quotation
- Failing to put quotation in quotation marks
- Copying text snippets without quotation marks and citation

Paraphrasing

: a restatement of a text, passage, or work giving the meaning in another form

Source: "Paraphrase." *Merriam-Webster.com Dictionary*, Merriam-Webster, https://www.merriam-webster.com/dictionary/paraphrase.

Citation

- The main reason for citing your sources is to give credit to those authors whose ideas you used in your research.
- Even when you do not quote directly from another work, if reading that source contributed to the ideas presented in your paper, you must give the authors proper credit by including their work in your bibliography.
- Citing your sources allows readers of your work to easily find the sources to which you've referred.

Ways to Avoid Plagiarism

- Reading and note-taking
 - Always indicate in your notes which thoughts and ideas come from other authors, and which come from you. For own convenience, always record relevant information in your notes (author, title, page, URL)
- Writing paraphrases, summaries
- Writing direct quotations

Seems complicated?

Before you decide to cheat:

- You can refer to the online sources and academic writing guides.
- You can reach out to the academic staff for further instruction.
- You can ask fellow students of the faculty for help and advice. Follow academic regulations, do not cheat and enjoy your educational journey!
