He was a lecturer at Harvard University, where he completed a postdoctoral fellowship (2016-2018). Using interdisciplinary experimental methods, he studies the mechanisms of affective, cognitive and behavioral control that support social decision making. In particular, his research focuses on understanding how decision-making mechanisms compete and interact to guide choices around moral values, integrity and adherence to norms.
