# Global mobility is part of your education

The Faculty maintains 212 Erasmus+ exchange agreements with universities across the EU and EFTA countries, allowing students to spend a semester or a year at leading European institutions. Our Erasmus+ partners include Sciences Po, Sorbonne University, Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität München, Dublin City University, Università degli Studi di Padova, Universiteit van Amsterdam, Universidad Autónoma de Madrid, the University of York, and Université de Genève.



Students participating in Erasmus+ exchanges receive **scholarships of up to €600 per month** through the Erasmus+ programme.

Beyond Europe, the Faculty also maintains **40 bilateral agreements worldwide**, including partners from North America, East Asia, South Asia, Latin-America, Australasia, providing additional opportunities for global academic cooperation.

Students can take part in study exchanges or international internships, gaining valuable academic and intercultural experience.

The annual tuition fee for all programmes offered by the Faculty is **€4,300 per academic year**.

The fee is the same for all programmes and is indicated for the 2026 academic year.

Tuition fees for future academic years may be subject to change.

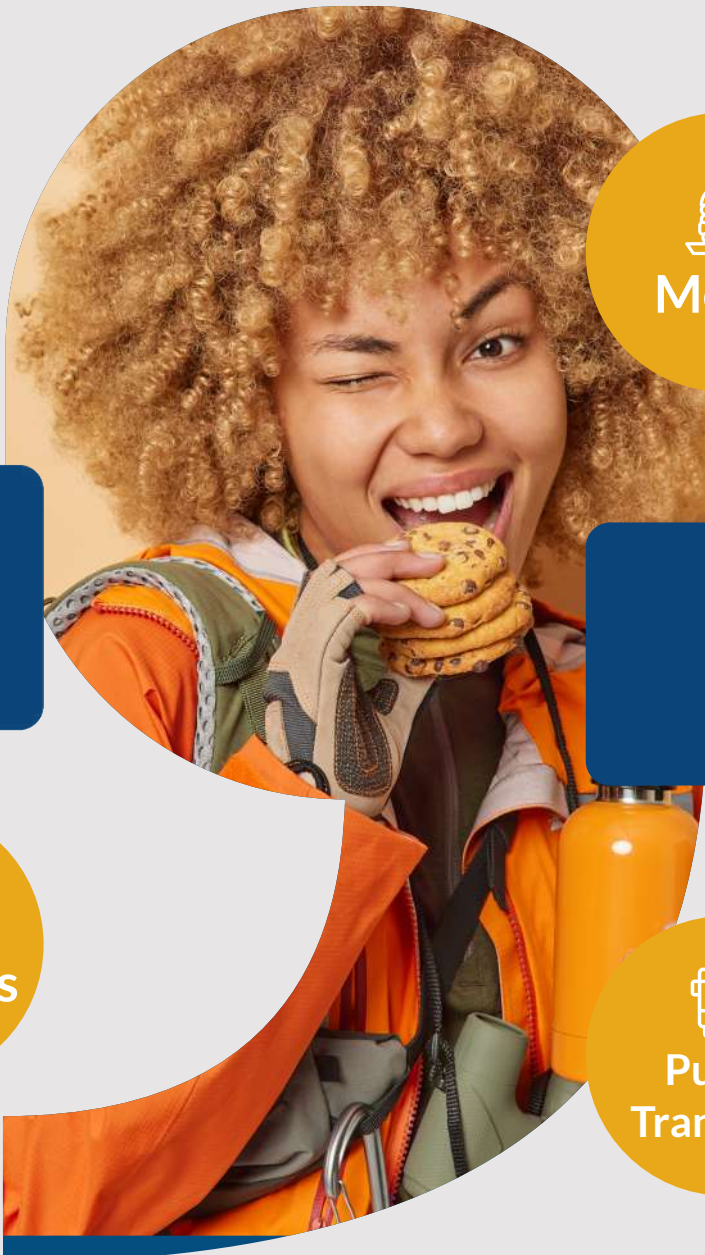
## Scholarships

The University of Warsaw offers several scholarships to support top-performing international students, including:

- **Rector's Scholarship** – for students with outstanding academic achievements
- **Scholarship to Start** – for top-performing first-year students
- **Merit-based Scholarships** – for students maintaining excellent results during their studies
- **Special Scholarships & Grants** – e.g., NAWA scholarships, Visegrad Fund grants, or support for students from specific countries or under-represented regions
- **Other support** – partial tuition waivers or grants for research projects, internships, or competitions annual tuition fee for all programmes offered by the Faculty is €4,300 per academic year.

Applications open: February



### Typical required documents

- Secondary school certificate or Bachelor's degree diploma
- Transcript of records
- Proof of English-language proficiency
- Copy of passport
- Passport-style photo

Additional documents may be required depending on the programme.

### Support for international students

The University of Warsaw **Welcome Point** assists international students with visa procedures, accommodation, and administrative formalities to help you settle in Warsaw.

# How to enrol?

## Application in 4 steps

### Register online

Create an account in the IRK system and select your programme.

### Submit your application

Complete the form and upload the required documents.

### Pay the application fee

The standard application fee is **85 PLN per programme** (100 PLN if an entrance exam or interview is required).

### Receive your admission decision

Results are published in your IRK account. Admitted candidates then submit final documents to complete enrolment.

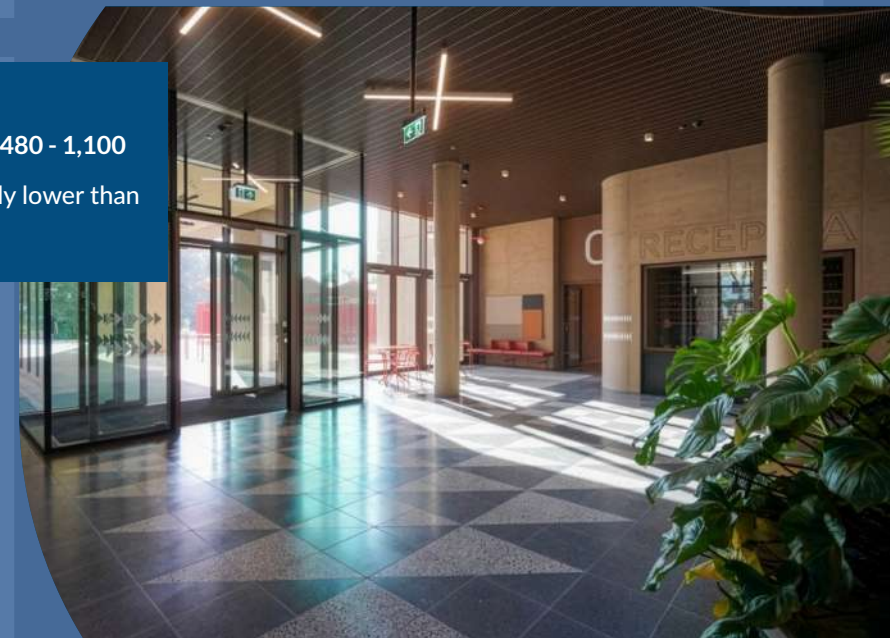

## Transport

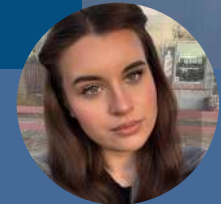
Getting around the city and beyond is easy:

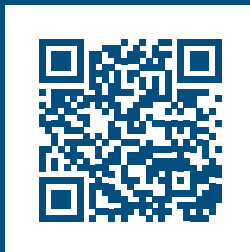
